LT. COL. CLYDE WOLTMAN WAS BORN IN SPOKANE, WA IN 1959. HE GRADUATED IN 1981 FROM USC WITH A Bachelor of Science DEGREE IN ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING AND WAS COMMISIONED IN THE MARINE CORPS IN 1982.

HE WAS DESIGNATED A NAVAL OFFICER IN 1985 AND SUBSEQUENTLY ASSIGNED TO MARINE ATTACK SQUADRON 102 FOR OPERATIONAL TRAINING IN THE A-4M SKYHAWK. IN NOVEMBER OF 86 HE WAS ASSIGNED TO VMA-211 WHERE HE SERVED AS LOGISTICS AND EMBARKATION OFFICER. DURING THIS TWO-YEAR PERIOD HE DEPLOYED TWICE TO WESTPAC.

IN 1988 HE UNDERWENT TRANSITION RAINING IN THE AV-8B HARRIER WITH MARINE ATTACK TRAING SQUADRON 203. IN NOV 88 HE WAS ASSIGNED TO VMA-513 WHERE HE SERVED AS MAINT QC OFFICER AND LATER, AS PILOT TRAINING OFFICER.

IN AUG 90 AT THE ONSET OF THE IRAQ-KUWAIT CRISIS, HE WAS REASSIGNED TO VMA-311 FOR DEPLOYMENT TO THE MIDDLE EAST. HE PARTICIPATED IN DESERT SHIELD /DESERT STORM FROM 15 AUG 90 TO 15 APR 91. DURING THIS COMBAT TOUR HE FLEW 40 COMBAT MISSIONS IN THE KTO.

FROM AUG 91 TO NOV 93 HE SERVED AS USMC EXCHANGE PILOT WITH THE SPANISH NAVY. DURING THI STOUR HE FLEW EAV-8B HARRIER AND DEPLOYED FROM THE SPANISH CARRIER *PRINCIPE DE AUSURIAS*.

FROM 1993-96 HE ONCE AGAIN SERVED WITH VMA-311 DURING WHICH TIME HE WAS DIRECTOR OF SAFETY AND STANDARDIZATION. SQUADRON MO AND XO. HE DEPLOYED ONCE TO WESTPAC WITH THE SQUADRON.

IN 1996HE WAS ASSIGNED TO VMA-211 AS THE XO AND 11TH MEU AV-8B DETATCHMENT OIC. DURING THE SIX-MONTH DEPLOYMENT ON BOARD THE *USS ESSEX* HIS DETATCHMENT PARTICIPATED IN OPERATION SOUTHERN WATCH.

IN 1997 HE WAS ASSIGNED TO THE DEFENSE LANGUAGE INSTITUTE FOR FORIEGN LANGUAGE TRAINING IN PREPARATION FOR HIS INTERMEDIATE LEVEL SCHOOL TOUR AT THE FRENCH JOINT WAR COLLEGE IN PARIS WHICH HE ATTENDED JAN 98 TO JUNE 99. 

Jim,

I hope all is well. I am having trouble getting an email out to all former Tomcats due to number of recipients, so I thought I would send to you & Fred. I thought some might like this message and our recent squadron photo as well.

Sixty years ago from this up-coming December 1st, Marine Fighting Squadron 311 was one of the many commands that were established during the rapid expansion of our Armed Forces after the attack on Pearl Harbor. This squadron was born of war and baptized in the islands of the Pacific. Just nine short months after its commissioning, "Fighting 311" began its historic journey that would later take the squadron to the homeland of the imperial Japanese Empire. Two months after beginning its journey westward "Fighting 311" found itself based at the Seabee constructed airfield on Wallis Island. Wallis Island was no paradise, but instead a remote, hot, damp, volcanic island. Conditions were austere; days were long. This was to be the location of the squadron's first Marine Corps birthday celebration. Over the history of this

squadron, little has changed regarding what is expected of us. VMA-311, unlike any other squadron in MAG 13 today, has participated in every major conflict our nation has faced since its birth. And throughout its history one thing has remained unchanged; 311 has done what others would consider the impossible. Each time, this squadron has risen to overcome its challenges. This is signified on our squadron patch with the band-aid on the cat's bottom. I encourage all Tomcats to embrace the "can-do" heritage of your past. Recognize that you are the present. You are the Corps. Look at the Marine on your left and right. Can he or she depend on you; can you depend on them? Finally, I challenge each and every Marine to uphold the proud heritage of our Corps and this squadron. Your lineage is that of a warfighter. You are here at this point in history by design - right now; right here. As it was in 1942 and throughout our history, the United States of America will not tolerate tyranny of any kind. I know when called upon, VMA-311 will be ready to meet any challenge, head-on.



From: Commanding Officer

To: ALL Hands

I wish to take this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation to all members of this command for the untiring attention to duty that you displayed during the period of time we were flying combat missions against the enemy and the cooperation and loyalty rendered by you during this truce period. Good afternoon TOMCATS. Got an email from someone who needs your help if you can. This is from a David Prendergast: "I have been in contact with LtCol. Charles Palmer, USMC (Ret.) who has been searching for someone who might assist in obtaining information regarding the crash and death of 1st Lt. Thomas H. Hawking (KIA) September 16, 1966 A-4E #152020 with VMA-311, MAG 12 in Chu Lai. Please contact him at cbp.mlp@sbcglobal.net Also , you can contact me at 707-443-4463, or www.sats-eaf.org The Lts. son is the Col.s nephew, and they are both trying to locate anyone who may have information on this matter."

Help this guy out if you can. This was a little before my time but I pulled the names with emails off the data base that were from this time frame. I will put this in upcoming newsletter and maybe Fred can put it on our web page. Thanks guys. Semper Fi--Jim Galchick

Wish I could help, but left Chu Lai in May 1966 from MABS-12 after VMA-214 Blacksheep returned to CONUS. But there should be someone who can help. Semper Fi Fred

A follow up on this request for help!
On 12/18/2003 I received this email and think it needs to be seen.
Speaking for myself, it affects me more now than it did while I was In 'NAM.

Dear Bob Hughes, Jim Galchick and Con Silard,

I appreciate your responses to my request. I don't know if David Prendergast told you I was also in Chu Lai at that time. I was a few miles north of you at MACS 7, where the large radar domes sat above MAG 36's pads. I went out in March 66 and extended to stay until July 67 when the Sqdn was replaced by MACS 4 on Monkey Mt by Danang. About the time I retired in '73 I acquired a new nephew when Lt Tom Hawking's widow married my wife's brother. Chris Hawking was born a few weeks after his father was killed. After I learned he wanted information about his father, I went to the www.skyhawk site and found the Lt listed on the casualty list with a short report of the circumstances. That's also where I found David Prendergast listed as the MAG 12 contact. David has copies of Chronological Reports and other reference books. These are some of the excerpts he was able to find and send to me. Quoting:

I first looked at a source book I use for quick reference. "Vietnam Air Losses" by Chris Hobson, Published by Midland Publishing in 2001. They report as follows:

"16 September 1966

A-4E #152020 VMA-311, MAG-12, USMC Chu Lai 1Lt Thomas Howard Hawking (KIA)

Although the Marine Corps A-4 squadrons were primarily in Vietnam to support Marine ground troops, they also supported non-Marine Corps operations when required. Operation Seward was a minor offensive by the Army's 101st Airborne Division against the Viet Cong's 5th Division in Phu Yen province. During a strike in support of Operation Seward a VMA-311 Skyhawk hit trees as it pulled from its attack on a target about 12 miles

southwest of Tuy Hoa. The pilot ejected safely and was spotted by an Army UH-1 Huey, which attempted to rescue him. Tragically, the helicopter was not equipped for rescue work and the pilot slipped out of the makeshift sling and fell 1,000 feet to his death."

As noted, it was an un-equipped "ARMY" UH-1 Huey that attempted the rescue.

I have reviewed and printed the U.S.M.C. Command Chronology for September 1-30, 1966 for VMA-311

On page 4, paragraph number 2, it states:

"1stLt T.H. Hawking was killed on 16 September during the Helicopter rescue attempt following a successful ejection."

I located additional references to the Sept. 16th crash in the 1st MAW Command Chronology for September, 1966 at page 20. The document has 132 pages, too much to email. It states, at page 20:

"(S) 16 September - One A4E from VMA-311 was lost at (CQ 024 268) approximately 165 miles SSE of Chu Lai in the II Corps area. The pilot made a successful ejection after collision with ground. The pilot was picked up from the ground by U.S. Army UH-1B. However, the pilot who was picked up from the ground sustained fatal nujuries, when he dropped/fell from the rigged pick up gear at an altitude of 800 to 1,000 feet." End of quote.

Because of your interest in VMA 311 history I thought you might like to see what David was able to find for Chris. Chris says he heard a story regaaarding the large amount of money chits (MPC?) that were among his Dad's personal effects. The story is that his Dad was a heavy winner at cards the previous night and had also been drinking quite a bit. For the information of anyone who might have close knowledge of Lt Hawking, Chris doesn't exclude pilot error although he hopes it wasn't. I include this in hopes someone who knew Lt H closely might come forward. Chris called them "chits", so I guessed MPC, although I would have expected whoever packed his gear to not let them out of country.
