(We went to Chu Lai in mid April according to my diary. You are now in the 311 alumni assn. I don't know if we are formal or not-jg)

RICHARD HOLLISTER: I SERVED WITH THE MARINES FROM 1966-1970. WHILE I WAS IN VIETNAM I WAS ASSIGNED TO VMA-311 1968-69. I WAS A HYDRAULICS MECHANIC ON THE A4-E SKYHAWK. (Anyone in that time frame remember Rich? I can't place him. His email is skipper14150@yahoo.com. He never got back to me and this was his only transmission-jg)

TIMOTHY KNIGHT, POTTSTOWN, PA "I RAN ACROSS YOUR WEB SIGHT WHILE SURFING THE NET. MY DAD WAS A CORSAIR PILOT IN VMF-311 DURING WWII. TOMCAT FACT: 2 JULY 1945: The squadron participated in a fighter sweep over Kyushu. The flight consisted of 4 Corsairs from VMF-224 and 4 From VMF-311. While flying over Japan the fighters passed over 40 enemy fighters going in the opposite direction and switched to a defensive mode and managed to down 8 enemy aircraft without a single loss. The two squadrons split the kills with four each. Two more runs to Kyushu failed to catch any more of the enemy in the air."

PETE TKACHUK, EXETER, NH: "ON 3 JAN 08 I RETIRED AFTER 38 YEARS OF COMBINED SERVICE WITH THE MARINE CORPS AND DEPT. OF DEFENSE...IT'S BEEN A GOOD RIDE BUT IT'S NOT OVER YET...GOD WILLING. SEEING YOU AT COOKIE'S IN NOVEMBER...WE SPOKE OF THE REUNION AND I HAD BEEN KEEPING AN EYE OUT FOR THE NEWSLETTER VIA THE EMAIL. I HADN'T RECEIVED ONE, SO I DID A SEARCH THIS EVENING TO SEE IF I COULD FIND ANYTHING ON THE NET...I DID FIND A LETTER STATING THE DATES IN SEPT. AND THE LOCATION...I TOLD HER THAT IT WAS CLOSE ENOUGH FOR US TO CATCH UP WITH ALL YOU MARINES SOMETIME DURING THOSE DAYS...I TRIED CALLING DON SMITH TODAY IN ORDER TO MAKE CONTACT WITH HIM...ANYWAY, JUST TOUCHING BASE AND ALSO UPDATING MY EMAIL ADDRESS JUST IN CASE..TAKE CARE AND SEMPER FIDELIS." (Great time at Cookie's Tavern on November 10th...got some flicks of that day and am trying to figure out how to get them printed off the email that the Phantom sent-jg)

JIM DAWSON, PONTIAC, MI: "BECAUSE OF YOUR JANUARY 2008 NEWSLETTER EDITION, I CONTACTED GLENN KESSLER. I KNEW HIS FATHER, FRANK, WHO SERVED WITH ME IN VMF-155 AND VMF-311...GLENN CAME TO PONTIAC AND WE SPENT SOME TIME TOGETHER. I SHOWED HIM OUR WAR MUSEUM AND A CITY TOUR (ALL OF 15 MINUTES!) ... WE HAD LUNCH AND GLENN FELT HE MIGHT BE ABLE TO RETURN ON ANOTHER TRIP...FRANK DIED OF CANCER AT APPROXIMATLY 58 YEARS OLD, PER GLENN. (This is a good example of contacting those family members who are looking for those that served with their fathers. Too often not much is related to families about military service and to some that info is an important bridge. Thanks Jim for that. I'm sure Glenn appreciated the time.-jg)

EVERETT KIMBALL, PENDLETON, OR: "I JOINED THE USMC IN 1946 AND TOOK MY BASIC TRAINING IN SAN DIEGO. OUR DRILL INSTRUCTOR WAS SGT. LIMPUS. I WAS THEN SENT TO EL TORO WITH VMF-513. I WORKED IN ORDNANCE WITH CORSAIRS AND WAS DISCHARGED IN MARCH 1948. JOINED THE RESERVES (NON ACTIVE) AND WAS CALLED BACK WHEN THE KOREAN WAR BROKE OUT, REPORTED BACK TO EL TORO IN 1950 AND WAS ATTACHED TO VMF-311 PANTHER JETS. WE BOARDED THE USS BARROKO AIR CRAFT CARRIER IN SAN DIEGO. WE WENT TO TOKYO BAY AND TIED UP FOR 2 OR 3 DAYS AND THEN TO SASEBO AND UNLOADED PLANES AND GEAR. THEN BY 10PM THAT NIGHT WE BOARDED THE TRANSPORT PLANE TO KEMPO, NORTH KOREA. WE SET UP OPERATIONS ON A SMALL AIRFIELD. IT WAS THE EVACUATION POINT FOR THE CHOSIN RESERVOIR, FROM THERE BACK TO JAPAN AND SPENT TWO OR THREE WEEKS. THEN WE WENT TO PUSSAN AND SPENT OUITE A BIT OF TIME THERE. JETS WERE FLYING ALL THE TIME. I WENT BACK TO JAPAN AND SPENT R & R THERE THEN BOARDED AN LST AND WENT TO K-3 AND SPENT THE REST OF MY TIME THERE. I CAME HOME IN 1951. MY SERVICE NUMBER WAS 625214 THE FIRST TIME AND WHEN I WAS RECALLED THEY ADDED AN R TO IT, 625214R. SOME OF THE GUYS I SERVED WITH WERE ALLEN BAIRD, BALLARD, FREEMAN AND NORRIS. MY MEMORY IS SHOWING...THANKS FOR THE NEWSLETTER...SORRY I HAVEN'T MADE IT TO ANY OF THE REUNIONS BUT I PROBABLY NEVER WILL."

MIKE HILE, COLORADO SPRINGS, CO: "THANKS FOR THE HEADS UP ON THE NEWSLETTER AND CONTINUING TO HEAD THIS EFFORT. I ENJOY

READING EVERY ISSUE. YES, I HAD COL. MIKE YUNCK'S NAME PAINTED ON THE JETS DURING THE KICKOFF OF "OPERATION IRAQUI FREEDOM". IT WAS THE IDEA OF MY XO, ED "JETHRO" SEXTON TO TIE THE CURRENT MARINES WITH THEIR PAST HERITAGE." (As an added note, anyone who is on line and seen the pictures sent to the web page by Col. COL. CLYDE M. WOLTMAN, COMMANDING OFFICER MAG -13: "ON 29 NOV 2007 LTCOL ROBERT SOFGE PASSED ON HIS COMMAND TO LT COL JOHN CANE. SINCE THEN LT COL CANE HAS BEEN EXTRAORDINARILY BUSY PREPARING THE TOMCATS FOR DEPLOYMENT IN SUPPORT OF COMBAT OPS IN OIF. WITHIN THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS HIS SQUADRON WILL BE SPLIT INTO A MEU AVIATION DETATCHMENT AND A SQUADRON (MINUS); BOTH DEPLOYING TO THE MIDDLE EAST BY MIS SPRING...AS YOU CAN SURMISE, THE TOMCATS WILL BE DEPLOYED DURING SEPTEMBER 2008. I AM CONFIDENT THAT WE CAN PROVIDE A GUEST SPEAKER FOR YOU IN PHILLY. I WOULD BE HONORED TO DO SO MYSELF, BUT CAN'T COMMIT AT THIS MOMENT. I WILL DISCUSS OPTIONS WITH LT COL CANE."

LT COL JOHN CANE, COMMANDING OFFICER, VMA-311: (16 APRIL 2008. INFORMATIONAL UPDATE FROM 311 IN IRAQ)

"ON 3 APRIL 2008 ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY TWO TOMCATS AND TEN JETS ARRIVED AT AL ASAD AIR BASE, IRAQ TO CONDUCT FLIGHT OPS IN SUPPORT OR OPERATION IRAQUI FREEDOM, IT WAS A LONG TRIP, AS WE HAD TO TRAVEL THROUGH BASES OF CHERRY POINT, LAJES PORTUGAL AND SIGONELLA SICILY. THE SQUADRON AND 10 JETS TRAVELED OVER 12,000 MILES IN SIX DIFFERENT GROUPS TO GET TO AL ASAD AIRBASE-AND THOUGH GETTING THE SQUADRON TO IRAQ IN ITSELF WAS NO SIMPLE TASK, THE TOMCATS MADE IT LOOK EASY AND WERE READY TO CONDUCT FLIGHT OPS WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER THEIR ARRIVAL. THE SQUADRON EXHAUSTED A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT OF EFFORT PREPARING FOR THIS DEPLOYMENT-ALL THEIR HARD WORK PAID OFF- AND I AM TREMENDOUSLY PROUD OF THE MARINES AND THE MAGNIFICENT JOB THEY ACCOMPLISHED. THOUGH I AM CERTAIN ALL THE MARINES WOULD RATHER BE HOME WITH FAMILY, THE TOMCATS ARE READY TO FIGHT AND PROUD TO BE SERVING THEIR COUNTRY.

WE CONDUCTED A TRANSFER OF AUTHORITY WITH THE VMA-542 ON APRIL 5TH. ONCE THE TIGERS DEPARTED IRAQ IT ONLY TOOK A FEW HOURS FOR THE TOMCATS TO "MARK" THEIR TERRITORY WITH ALL THINGS TOMCAT. ONE OF THE MORE SIGNIFICANT MARKINGS IS A MASSIVE "VMA-311 TOMCATS" SIGN MADE FROM SANDBAGS AND ARRANGED ON TOP OF ONE OF OUR HARDENED CONCRETE HANGERS AT THE APPROACH END OF RUNWAY 27L. IF YOU FLY INTO AL ASAD AIR BASE, THERE IS NO WAY TO MISS THAT THE TOMCATS HAVE RETURNED

TO IRAQ.

A SECOND ELEMENT OF TOMCATS REMAINS IN YUMA AND WILL DEPLOY IN EARLY MAY 2008. TOMCAT FACT: DURING THE EARLY 1950S THE VMF-311 SQUADRON ISIGNIA BEGAN APPEARING ON its AIRCRAFT. JUST AS THE SQUADRON INSIGNIA BECAME A NOTICABLE IDENTIFICATION FOR THE AIRCRAFT, THE PILOTS BECAME NOTICABLE BY THE SCARVES THEY PURCHASED TO GO ALONG WITH THE INSIGNIA. THESE WERE SOFT BABY BLUE OVERPRINTED WITH PINK HEARTS AND THE SQUADRON NAME. NEEDLESS TO SAY THESE BECAME HIGHLY PRIZED ITEMS PARTICULARLY IN INFANTRY CIRCLES DURING THE WAR. (ONE OF THE SCARVES HAS SERVED THE RAVENGES OF TIME AND CAN BE SEEN AT THE MARINE CORPS AVIATION MUSEUM IN QUANTICO, VIRGINIA.)
